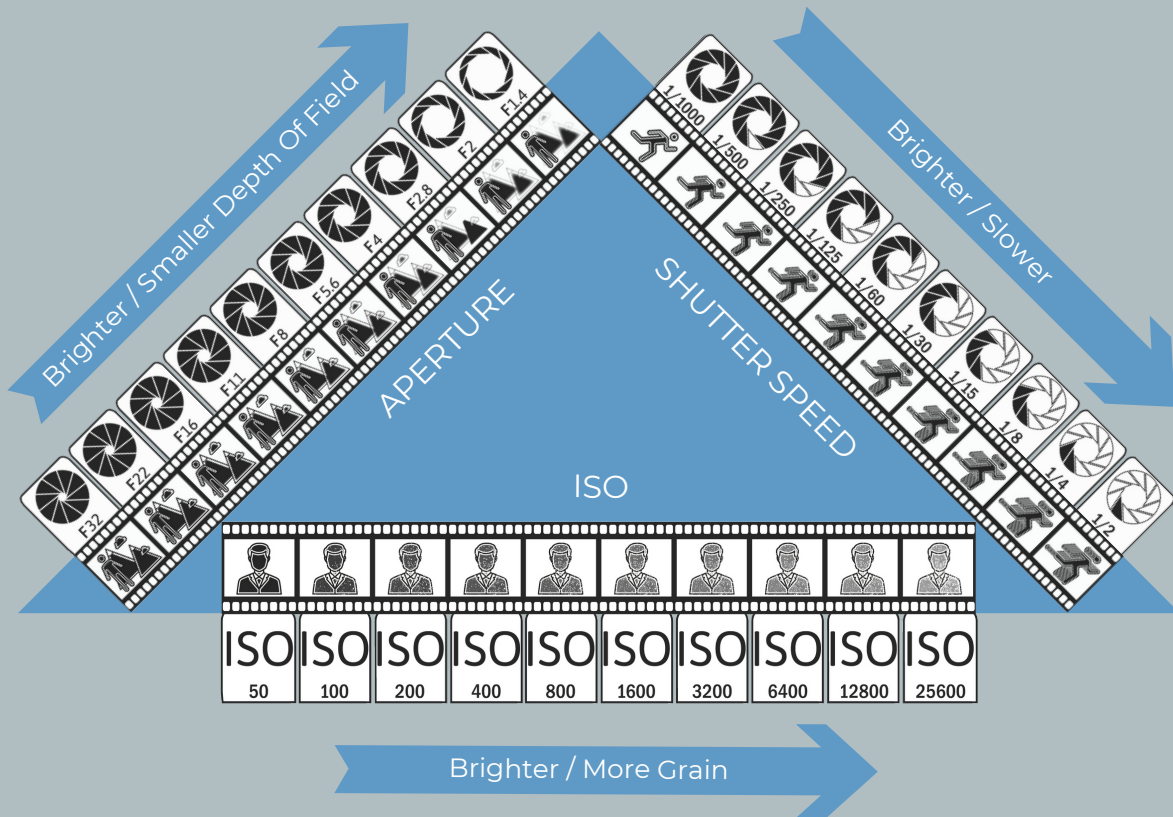


CAMERA SETTINGS CHEAT SHEET



How To Choose The Best Camera Settings Every Time

STEP 1:

Decide which is the most important thing about your scene. The one or two things you can't compromise.

STEP 2:

Adjust the other non-critical exposure elements to achieve the optimal exposure for your image.

EXAMPLES

SILKY SMOOTH WATERFALL

No Compromise: **Slow Shutter Speed**
Adjust: **Aperture & ISO**

MOUNTAINS & FOREGROUND

No Compromise: **Aperture f/8 or above**
Adjust: **Shutter Speed & ISO**

TWILIGHT SCENE

No Compromise: **Aperture & ISO**
Adjust: **Shutter Speed**

VISUAL EXAMPLES



MOST IMPORTANT

Having everything in focus

PRIORITY SETTING

Higher aperture value

CAMERA SETTINGS

ISO 100 | **f/11** | 1/160s



MOST IMPORTANT

Focus on water droplets

PRIORITY SETTING

Lower aperture value

CAMERA SETTINGS

ISO 400 | **f/5.6** | 1/500s



MOST IMPORTANT

Bird frozen in motion

PRIORITY SETTING

Fast shutter speed

CAMERA SETTINGS

ISO 100 | **f/7.1** | **1/800s**



MOST IMPORTANT

Silky smooth water

PRIORITY SETTING

Very slow shutter speed

CAMERA SETTINGS

ISO 200 | **f/7.1** | **30s**
